Penrose School

Context:

The Pupil Premium is a sum of money the school receives for each student who is:

- in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM) either currently or at any time during the last 6 years
- looked after by the local authority (CLA)
- adopted
- the son/daughter of service personnel

Nationally, the statistics show that students who are in receipt of PPG do less well than their peers in external exams. The aim of this money is to try to close that attainment gap, bridging the inequality which exists between PPG students and their peers.

The data at Penrose School shows no attainment gap between pupils who are in receipt of Pupil Premium and their peers.

PPG funding at Penrose School in 2016-17 was used to support the following:

- Specialist Communication support including specialist devices and resources
- Support to access mainstream provision
- 1:1 intervention in Core subject areas
- Access to music therapy
- Subsidise extra-curricular and enrichment activities including After-School Clubs
- Providing support to provide uniform
- To prepare pupils for learning by providing nurture breakfast
- To engage pupils in outdoor learning and Forest School
- To provide training for Thrive practitioners to ensure nurture principles are embedded throughout the school.
- To provide intensive support to families through the Family team and Malachi

The Governing Body is responsible for accounting for the impact of Pupil Premium. The provisional spend is reported to governors at the start of each financial year [in line with the allocation of PPG] and impact is reported at the end of each academic year.

Current funding for vulnerable groups in receipt of Pupil Premium:

- FSM = £1320 pa
- CLA/adopted pupils = £1900 pa
- Service Children = £300

Outcomes reported for Pupils at Penrose School – Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2

Outcomes for Pupil Premium Pupils
100% of Key Stage One pupils and 94% of Key Stage Two pupils met or exceeded their targets in Speaking and Listening.
100% of Key Stage One pupils and 95% of Key Stage 2 pupils met or exceeded their targets in English.
100% of Key Stage One pupils and 87% of Key Stage Two pupils met or exceeded their targets in Maths.
2 additional trainers have now completed Thrive practitioner training, ensuring nurture principles are embedded throughout the school. 37% of pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium funding made progress in Thrive.
Attendance: Pupil Premium pupils in both key stage one and two = 93.04% in comparison to 90.88% for the whole school.
Out of the 19 families who worked directly with the Family Team, 58% were eligible for Grant funding. Out of the 58% Pupil Premium families, there was a positive impact measured for 46% of these families (6). Out of the remaining 54%(7) they remained stable with no deterioration.
25% of pupils in receipt of PPG accessed Forest School and 100% accessed outdoor learning either as 1:1 intervention or as small group activity.
37% of pupils in receipt of PPG attended after school clubs. Pupils were given a range of different physical and sport activities which focused around healthy lifestyles.
