PENROSE SCHOOL Grant Funding 2018-19

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is additional government funding given to schools in order to enhance the progress, attainment and wellbeing of disadvantaged pupils. It is currently given to pupils in receipt of free school meals, children looked after by the Local Authority and the children of service personnel.

The pupil premium is additional monies given to schools to support pupils who are considered disadvantaged. The chosen measure for this is the entitlement of Free School Meals within the past 6 years, service children and those who are in Care.

In 2018-19 Penrose School was allocated £22,800. The following charts demonstrate what we anticipate the funding will be spent on and the impact it will have to disadvantaged children.

Penrose school has 47% of pupils on roll eligible for Pupil Premium funding.

How the Governing Body holds school leaders to account for the spending of the Pupil Premium Grant.

The Executive Headteacher reports annually on how the Pupil Premium Grant has been spent in the previous year and the impact that it has had on pupil progress and well-being. It also reports on what it intends to spend the current year Pupil premium Grant on in order to enhance the progress and well-being in the next year.

Penrose School Pupil Premium Provision 2018-19

The current funding is approximately £22,800. Estimated costs have been allocated in the following way.

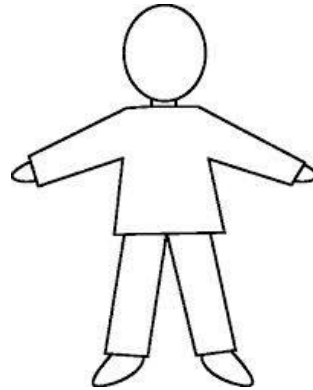
Interventions: Priority 1 – Quality Teaching for All

Overview: Pupils will have specialist input including Clunkerboard sessions. Specialist Occupational Therapy will be provided to targeted support. Pupils will have a number of enrichment opportunities through the year.

Cost £7,800

Aim/outcomes:

- Pupils will have Sensory programmes in place and a reduction in the number of incidents of challenging behavior.
- An increase in the number of pupils accessing enrichment activities.



Supporting the whole child

Interventions: Priority 2 – Targeted Support

Overview: To provide holiday clubs for pupils.

Cost £8,500

Aims/outcomes:

- Pupils will be able to access high quality holiday provision
- Holiday provision will also be available for siblings which will support family engagement.
- Increased number of pupils accessing Holiday provision.

Interventions: Priority 3 – Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Overview: To provide Nurture breakfast daily, to support the provision of uniform and resources to support pupils with access to learning. To provide after school clubs to promote healthy lifestyles and physical activity.

Cost: £6,500

Aim/Outcomes:

- Pupils will have a healthy breakfast every day with their peers, promoting a sense of belonging.
- Support for pupils to access uniform and specialist resources to support them in accessing learning, a greater sense of belonging and increased engagement in learning.
- To increase the number of pupils engaging in afterschool clubs.

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
